MINUTES OF THE VCTC TRANSPORTATION TECHNICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE June 16, 2011

Item No. 1 - Call to order

Chair David Klotzle called the meeting to order at 9:04 AM. The attached attendance sheet shows those present.

Item No. 2 - Public Comments

Samia Maximous said the PSE package for Hwy 101 HOV lane improvement project between Santa Barbara and Ventura counties has been completed and reached the RTL milestone and will be in line for future funding through CMIA funds.

Item No. 3 - Approval of March 17, 2011 Minutes

David Fleisch made a motion to approve the March 17, 2011 meeting minutes, it was seconded by Jay Spurgin, and the motion was approved unanimously.

<u>Item No. 4 – County of Ventura Transportation Department Strategic Plan & RTP issues</u>

Steve DeGeorge handed out a memo and presented the item saying a new issue has surfaced related to developing the strategic plan for all the cities and it is the Regional Transportation Plan (RTP). This plan is being updated by SCAG and the future transportation projects list for the entire county should be updated. Steve handed out a copy of the current list and said many cities did not input any information into this list. This is a good opportunity to have more projects added as part of the RTP update. Samia added this list can help all the agencies to complete the Strategic Plan list that was discussed during the previous TTAC meeting. Some questions were raised during the meeting as to what should be included in these proposed transportation projects. Samia said there should not be any storm drain improvements, utility relocation, sidewalk, ADA. David Klotzle requested to have an e-mail from VCTC with clear outline of the requested items from all agencies and a timeline. Samia and Steve will follow-up on this issue.

Item No. 5 - Fund Status Report and Monitoring of CMAQ, STP & TE projects & Monitoring

Peter DeHaan referred to Attachment B which shows the projects that will be obligated this federal fiscal year specifically by September 2011. Peter also referred to Attachment C which is a new attachment that shows the expected projects that maybe obligated next federal fiscal year. Peter requested all agencies to present a quick update at the meeting. Jay Spurgin said the Wendy Drive project is expected to be obligated in August this year. Morris Zarbi said August 1st is the last date to present and E-76 application for a project that need to be obligated this federal fiscal year. Andy Santamaria said he has a street rehab project that is expected to be obligated in August 2012. Morris said Wooley Rd. project for Oxnard maybe obligated soon.

Peter also gave an update about the upcoming federal transportation bill. He said Darren went Washington D.C. and they expect the new bill would be about \$318 billion instead of \$380 billion. The feds are studying the role of the government into transportation and looking to fund only the large transportation projects, which may have an effect on the types of projects to be included in this bill.

Item No. 6 - Comprehensive Transportation Plan - possible presentations to city transportation

committees)

Peter DeHaan summarized item saying VCTC Transportation Revenue Committee requested that staff follow up with city staffs to arrange presentations on the Plan to city Transportation Committees. Peter asked if the local agencies have transportation committees and if it is possible to make presentations regarding future transportation revenues. The cities of Camarillo, Moorpark, Thousand Oaks and Oxnard indicated they have transportation committees. Peter will follow-up with them to schedule these presentations in the future.

Item No. 7 - Report on Bicycle Transportation Account Project Selection Committee

Peter DeHaan was a part of the selection committee for a northern California and is sharing with the group his experience for future submittals of grant related bicycle applications. Peter said it important to explain in the application the objective of the project and why the agency decided to submit an application. Letters of support from other affected agencies such a school or recreation district. In addition, state law tries to have a geographic equity, however, if the agency has projects well presented in the applications and have merit they can go over the equity line. For example, District 5 received 2.5 times their share. Finally, the maps associated with the application are very important as they help the committee to understand the purpose of the project. Morris Zarbi commented federally funded State Route to School has a red flag for those agencies that received similar funds in the past and did not obligate them at the time of applying for the next cycle; they will not be able to apply for the new cycle.

<u>Item No. 8 – LTF Apportionment</u>

Samia Maximous said this item has been already presented and acted on by the Commission earlier this month. It is presented to you for your information. Since the LTF funds have received an increase in revenue the Commission chose to set aside a 10% reserve for future years if the revenues are less than projected. The reserve will help to close the gap instead of having to re-apportion the revenues which the agencies usually planned in their budget. The draft apportionments for FY 2011/12 show an increase in revenue for all agencies as illustrated in Attachment 1 of the report.

<u>Item No. 9- Presentation by Caltrans New Right of Way procedures for certification re:E-76 application</u>

Linda Tong, Caltrans District 7, Right of Way division, made a presentation regarding the new procedures for obtaining right of way certification associated with the E-76 application. She said that right of way division needs to be informed of the project in advance of applying for the application and know if there are considerable issues to work with the local agencies. Her division will make all requirements known upfront in order to give ample time to submit the information required with the E-76 application. Linda said a new exhibit 13-A is in draft form will replace the "no right of way certification." She also said they just developed a new form for "non-infrastructure" type projects that do not require right of way acquisition. Linda informed the group that FHWA opened a new southern California regional office which will cover Districts 7,8,11 & 12. The office is situated in down town Los Angeles on Figueroa Street. The office will expedite the process on FHWA side as they will deal with oversight and audit issues. Robert Wong, Caltrans, Local Programs indicated they are working on a draft oversight of highway policy and it will be available next month. He will send the draft to VCTC staff for distribution to the group.

<u>Item No. 10– Presentation by Caltrans Potential changes in the highway design manual for street</u> widths, bike paths and pedestrian safety issues

Samia said VCTC staff invited a Caltrans representative to give an update on the potential changes in the Highway Design Manual regarding street widths, bike paths and pedestrian safety issues. However, Caltrans representative declined at the last minute saying the changes are only being discussed internally with Caltrans staff at this time.

Item No. 11- CMP Update

Samia Maximous requested from the cities of Santa Paula and Fillmore to submit their CMP counts and calculations. She is also following up with County of Ventura Planning regarding the land use data. Carlos Hernandez with COH has been working on the update of the document and is almost finished with it. If we can have the remaining information the draft document can be presented to the group in August or September and then to the Commission for presentation and approval.

FROM: PETER DE HAAN, PROGRAMMING DIRECTOR

SUBJECT: STATUS OF FEDERAL STP, CMAQ, AND TE FUNDS

RECOMMENDATION:

Receive and file.

DISCUSSION:

Under federal law, STP, CMAQ, and TE funds apportioned to California lapse if they are not used within three years. AB 1012, which became law in October, 1999, applies the three-year lapsing rule for CMAQ and STP funds to each county. Furthermore, since, under California Transportation Commission (CTC) policy, TE funds are programmed based on County shares through the STIP, there are STIP timely-use requirements that apply to these funds. VCTC also uses the project schedule to ensure that the financially-constrained programming for the current year in the TIP includes all of the projects which are ready-to-go. Additionally, this schedule is provided to Caltrans for use in managing statewide obligational authority.

The attached table shows the projects anticipated to be obligated prior to the close of the federal fiscal year on September 30, 2011. This item also includes spreadsheets showing the status of all projects from TEA-21 and SAFETE-LU authorizations. In addition, there are spreadsheets showing the projects approved in the Mini-Call for projects.

Staff requests the Committee members review all of the listings for accuracy and provide updates and comments at the Committee meeting. This item also contains the proposed list of projects to be obligated in FY 2011/12, and staff requests the agencies ensure that this list includes all projects expected to be obligated during the upcoming year. As shown on the lists, there are no longer any funds scheduled to lapse in September, 2011. If all projects stay on schedule, no funds will lapse in FY 2011/12.

BALANCE TO SAN DIEGO ASSOCIATION OF GOVERNMENTS

RECOMMENDATION:

 Ratify two-year loan to the San Diego Association of Governments of up to \$5.4 million of the unused Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality program capacity.

BACKGROUND:

The Federal transportation authorizing legislation, the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU) which has currently been extended through September 30, 2011, authorizes various Federal transportation programs including the Surface Transportation Program (STP) and the Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ) program. VCTC is responsible for selecting Ventura County projects to be funded under these programs, and it designates the selected projects by submitting them to the Southern California Association of Governments for inclusion in the Federal Transportation Improvement Program (FTIP). SAFETEA-LU stipulates that VCTC can include in the FTIP sufficient projects to use all of the County's apportionment of authorized federal funds, so this apportionment effectively becomes VCTC's program capacity.

Although SAFETEA-LU determines the funding capacity for the FTIP, it does not determine the actual amount available to projects. That number is determined instead through the annual Federal appropriations process, with the typical result that the appropriated amounts are less than what was authorized under SAFETEA-LU and its extensions, and thus less than what is programmed in the FTIP. In the case of highway projects, the final federal commitment to fund the project does not occur until the project is ready for implementation, at which point Caltrans submits the funding request to the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) which obligates the Federal funds for the project. FHWA and Caltrans will not approve a project for funding unless it was included in the FTIP. The result of this arrangement is that there is always slightly less funding available for projects than what VCTC approved for inclusion in the FTIP. However, all projects typically receive Federal funding as soon as they are ready to go, because there are always some project delays which result in less funds being required than was planned.

Although the Congressional appropriations process is typically separate from the authorizing process, the Continuing Resolution which Congress approved to appropriate Fiscal Year 2010/11 funding included a provision to rescind a portion of unobligated prior year authorized program capacity balances for transportation. Based on this provision, the Federal government has rescinded \$235 million of unused authorized program capacity from California. The program

capacity balances can be taken, at Caltrans' discretion, from any of the unobligated transportation program capacity balances in California.

On the afternoon of Friday, July 8th, VCTC staff was notified of a decision by Caltrans to take \$78 million of the rescission from the unobligated statewide CMAQ program capacity, with the remainder of the rescission to come from apportionments programmed by Caltrans to State highways. The \$78 million CMAQ rescission will be applied to each county which on September 30th has remaining unobligated program capacity. The practical impact of this rescission is that there is no change to the available funding for CMAQ projects, but counties will lose the ability to program some, if not all, of the balance of authorized CMAQ capacity that was available on September 30th but not obligated to approved projects.

DISCUSSION:

Over the past year VCTC has worked with the Transportation Technical Advisory Committee (TTAC) to implement a more robust quarterly reporting process to track the status of project implementation and support timely project delivery. As a result, VCTC staff is aware that based on the approved project schedules, on September 30th VCTC will have an unobligated CMAQ program balance of \$9 - \$12 million which is at risk of being rescinded. However, the San Diego Association of Governments (SANDAG) has expressed interest in borrowing up to \$5.4 million of VCTC's CMAQ program balance for use on ready-to-go projects in San Diego County. The implementation of the loan would be contingent upon Caltrans obligating sufficient funds for San Diego County projects by the September 30th deadline. Such a loan of Ventura County program balance to SANDAG is not a loan of actual appropriated funds, but will prevent the permanent loss of the loaned program capacity.

Due to the tight timeline to obligate the funds for San Diego County projects by September 30th, it was necessary in August for SANDAG to initiate the request to Caltrans to obligate the \$5.4 million. Therefore, to protect the VCTC program capacity from rescission the Executive Director provided written approval for counting up to \$5.4 million of SANDAG's projects against VCTC's program balance, with the VCTC program capacity used by SANDAG to be restored to VCTC's balance in two years. The return of the loaned program capacity is contingent upon SANDAG receiving Federal apportionment during FY 2012/13. The risk of the loan not being repaid is very small, given that the Federal transportation program will almost certainly continue in some form through FY 2012/13. Furthermore, the risk of the Federal programs not continuing is significantly less than the risk of the \$5.4 million program balance being permanently lost were it not loaned to SANDAG. Based on the status of programmed CMAQ projects in Ventura County, it appears very likely that the \$5.4 million unused program balance will not be needed prior to FY 12/13.

It should be noted that the Orange County Transportation Authority and the Riverside County Transportation Commission are making similar program balance loans to SANDAG, with a total of \$25 million of program capacity being loaned to SANDAG by the three counties.

Although VCTC staff has already approved the transfer of \$5.4 million of CMAQ program capacity to SANDAG for 2 years, staff requests the Commission ratify this approval.

SUBJECT: PROGRAMMING OF SURFACE TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM (STP),

CONGESTION MITIGATION AND AIR QUALITY (CMAQ), AND

TRANSPORTATION ENHANCEMENT (TE) FUNDS

RECOMMENDATION:

 Approve attached guidelines for programming STP, CMAQ and TE funds during Fiscal Year (FY) 2011/12.

BACKGROUND:

As the Committees are aware, the current federal transportation authorization extends through September 30th. Although there has been significant discussion regarding a new multi-year transportation program, there appears to be little chance of passing such a program by September, and Senator Barbara Boxer has now proposed a four-month extension. Meanwhile, there is tremendous uncertainty regarding what a newly authorized transportation program would look like, with the leadership in the House calling for a six-year bill with annual funding reduced by 30% from the current level to constrain expenditures to the level of fuel tax revenues, while the Senate Environment & Public Works Committee has called for a two-year bill to continue current spending, adjusted upward for inflation. In addition, both proposals call for consolidation of transportation programs, with the House bill controversially proposing to end the Transportation Enhancement set-aside.

Recognizing that federal transportation funding is very likely to continue in some form into next year, it could be appropriate at this time to program additional funds, recognizing that the amount available to program will be relatively small given the uncertainty of the multi-year authorization. Therefore, Commission staff has developed the attached guidelines for the consideration of TTAC and TRANSCOM. The intent of these guidelines is to allow the programming of a relatively small amount of additional funding, while minimizing the amount of effort required to prepare application submittals and review and prioritize projects. Therefore, staff proposes to limit consideration to three projects of regional benefit (two of which are a continuation of ongoing funding committed to Transportation Control Measures in the Transportation Improvement Program), cost increases for previously-approved projects, and projects in the Mini Call for Projects which received relatively high scores but were not funded. The guidelines also take into

account the uncertainty regarding the future transit organizational structure in the county, and therefore continue the policy of the Mini Call for Projects to not fund bus purchases.

The following is a description of the amount of funds available to program. The analysis shows that although the available program balances are small, VCTC can consider programming some additional funds for eligible STP, TE, and CMAQ projects.

<u>STP</u>: A total of \$11.1 million is estimated to be available to program, which assumes continuation of the program in FY 2011/12 at the same level as FY 2010/11, and also includes a carryover due to prior apportionments being greater than assumed in the Mini Call for Projects.

<u>TE</u>: There is \$1.3 million available to program, based on the funds estimated for one year by the California Transportation Commission. This funding is contingent on the program being renewed by Congress.

CMAQ: As discussed in another item in this agenda, there is likely to be a significant rescission of CMAQ, effective September 30, 2011, although the rescinded amount may not be known until several months later due to the time it will take for Caltrans to calculate the final program balances and distribute the rescission amounts. Until the Ventura County rescission amount is known, there can be no presumption of having an available programming balance for FY 2011/12. However, the existing CMAQ program contains a large number of TE-eligible projects, so if the TE program is extended up to \$1.3 million of CMAQ projects could be switched to TE, potentially freeing up \$1.3 million in CMAQ capacity. Furthermore, VCTC has the option of funding most types of eligible CMAQ projects from the STP balance.

PROPOSED FISCAL YEAR 2011/12 CMAQ/STP/TE PROGRAMMING GUIDELINES

Funding Priorities

<u>Priority #1</u>: Three regional projects. (Regional Ridesharing, approximately \$443,000; Regional Transit Marketing, approximately \$500,000; and Route 101 Widening from Thousand Oaks to Ventura Project Initiation Document, amount to be determined)

<u>Priority #2</u>: Cost increases on previously-approved projects, other than bus purchases and road rehabilitation. (Funds cannot be used to replace local match committed in Mini-Call for Projects.)

<u>Priority #3</u>: Projects in Mini-Call for Projects, other than bus replacements, which scored 45 or above (Erbes Road Improvements in Thousand Oaks, Dunnigan/Arneil Traffic Signal in Camarillo.)

Eligibility Requirements

To receive funding, the project sponsor must provide VCTC with a letter stating the original project funding, including federal and local funds, the revised project funding, and the requested additional STP, CMAQ, or TE funds. The letter should also provide an update project schedule showing start and end dates for design, right-of-way, and construction.

During the FY 2011/12 Programming, the STP or CMAQ funds must be obligated, or the TE funds allocated, no later than November 1, 2012. Funding will only be programmed where the schedule shows the funds can be obligated/allocated by this deadline.
