SUBJECT: SB 1 UPDATE

DISCUSSION:

Local Streets and Roads: Under the Guidelines adopted by the California Transportation Commission on March 21, 2018, local jurisdictions must annually submit to CTC their lists of projects to receive SB 1 Local Streets and Roads funds, with CTC reviewing the lists for eligibility and voting to approve as a condition for dispersing each jurisdiction's apportionment of the funds. This local submittal information is also used to populate the online map posted at www.rebuildingca.ca.gov showing all SB 1 funded projects, with the local streets and roads projects being shown in lists which are accessed for each jurisdiction by clicking on the location of its City Hall or Hall of Administration.

Recently VCTC requested that each agency provide more detailed SB 1 project information to allow VCTC to post a map for Ventura County showing the actual geographic location of every SB 1 project. Staff is very appreciative of the quick response to that request, and has completed the online mapping task. Staff plans to demonstrate VCTC's online map at the TTAC meeting. Staff will also discuss the process for obtaining the FY 2018/19 SB 1 Local Streets and Roads projects to facilitate the posting of those projects once approved by CTC.

The FY 2018/19 project lists were due to CTC on May 1st. VCTC has received confirmation from CTC that all Ventura County agencies have submitted lists and the eligibility has been reviewed and confirmed. The allocation of the funds will be recommended for approval at the June 27th CTC meeting, and the VCTC Programming Director will be in attendance. The agenda for that meeting will be posted no later than June 15th.

FY 2019-20 Senate Bill 1 Planning Grants: Caltrans is scheduled to issue a Call-for-Projects for the Sustainable Communities and Climate Change Adaption Planning Grants this fall with Applications due in late October. The list of Sustainable Communities projects awarded in the last cycle is attached. The projects include a number of Complete Streets Projects, Corridor Improvement Plans, Safety Studies, and Feasibility Projects which help to ready projects for grant funding opportunities and implementation. The upcoming call-for-projects will include \$25 million from SB 1 for the Sustainable Communities program.
